Will you come and follow me if I but call your name?

Will you go where you don't know and never be the same?

Will you let my love be shown? Will you let my name be known?

Will you let my life be known in you, and you in me?

'Will You Come And Follow Me' (430 in Common Praise) or 'The Summons' written by John Bell, 1980, after joining Iona community.

> This hymn is a series of 13 questions posed by Jesus in the first person.

"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it." Matthew 7:24-27

Whenever Lent comes I often think of the above passage from the gospel of Matthew. I am only too aware that I spend much of my energy and time on houses built on sand. Many of my Lenten promises and disciplines have been about how to stop building those houses on sand or trying to mitigate the consequences. Lent should be a time when we are considering the house that has already been founded on rock. The problem isn't so much that I build on sand but rather that I neglect the work on this solid house, built on Jesus.

That work is the work of being a disciple. What I need to ask is what sort of disciple I have been, whether I been I truly following, and if I am truly heeding the words and example of the Master and changing my own life. I know that Jesus is patient with me. That as Julian of Norwich says, Jesus looks at my shortcomings "with pity, not with blame." Jesus wants to see us properly housed. He wants us to be true disciples, eager disciples, and ones who are already entering into the new life He offers, and who are shaped by His call to love as He has loved us.

In Lent, the Cathedral will be focusing on the question of our discipleship. You may choose to reflect on a commitment you are thinking about accepting, or a commitment that needs renewing. Sermons during the season will be touching upon discipleship. Our Wednesday evening studies will use Archbishop Rowan William's 2016 brief book 'Being Disciples', and on Saturday, 18 March, the Rev. Richard King, Canon for Mission in our Diocese, will be coming to speak in the morning on discipleship and mission.

To follow Jesus, to be a disciple, means to take up His dream and to make it real so that the love of God shows forth in our lives. May this Lent find us hearing again that call to 'Follow me" and being once again inspired by our Master and His dream.
